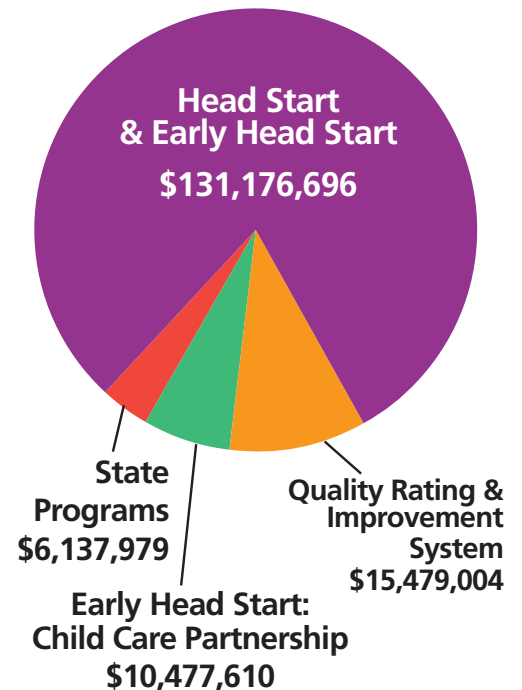

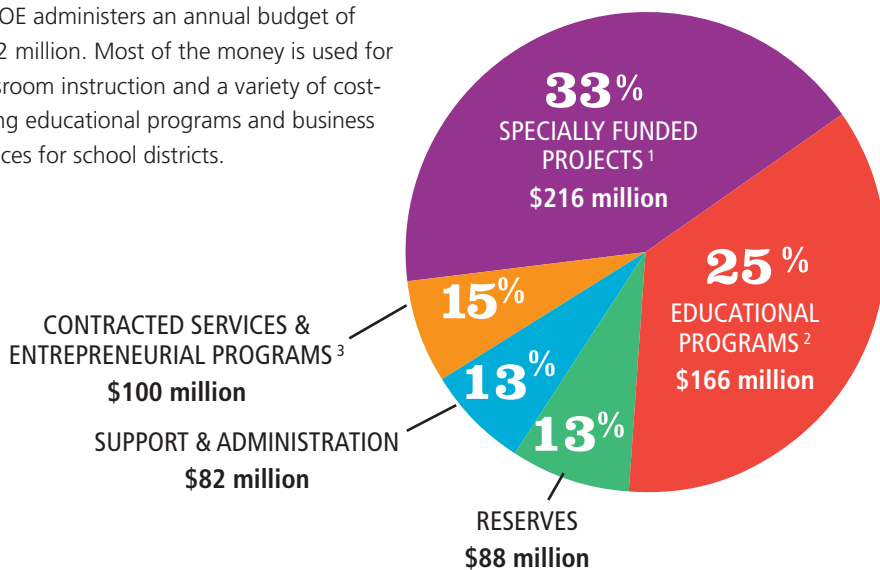

Supports Students & Serves Communities Through:

- Direct classroom instruction to 15,000 students a year, including juvenile offenders, children with disabilities, and other students with special needs and talents.
• Administration of comprehensive Head Start and Early Head Start programs
• Early childhood programs, parenting and literacy classes, job development services, and work and career preparation programs
• Countywide honors and scholastic competitions
• Monitoring and reporting on low-performing schools to give students a quality education, qualified teachers, and safe facilities

2015-16 LACOE BUDGET \$652 MILLION (Including Reserves)

LACOE administers an annual budget of \$652 million. Most of the money is used for classroom instruction and a variety of cost-saving educational programs and business services for school districts.
