
- LACOE pioneered Head Start services in Los Angeles in 1979

## LACOE HEAD START Health Outcomes for Children










\* Classroom Assessment Scoring System – (CLASS)

- Direct classroom instruction to 15,000 students a year, including juvenile offenders, children with disabilities, and other students with special needs and talents.
- Administration of comprehensive Head Start and Early Head Start programs
- Early childhood programs, parenting and literacy classes, job development services, and work and career preparation programs
- Countywide honors and scholastic competitions
- Monitoring and reporting on low-performing schools to give students a quality education, qualified teachers, and safe facilities

#### 2015-16 LACOE BUDGET \$652 MILLION (Including Reserves)

LACOE administers an annual budget of \$652 million. Most of the money is used for classroom instruction and a variety of costsaving educational programs and business SPECIALLY FUNDED services for school districts.
